An interaction meeting with Shri Bijoy Chatterjee, I.A.S., Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers & President Governing Council, CIPET along with Prof. (Dr.) S.K.Nayak, Director General CIPET was held on 12th February,2010 at CIPET Aurangabad.

During the course of above-mentioned meeting, a review of the construction activity being carried out by Govt. of Maharashtra through MIDC was taken. MIDC is executing CIPET construction activities with the allocated budgeted amount of Rs.8.75 Crores being sanctioned by the Govt. of Maharashtra. It is noticed that owing to the paucity of the funds, MIDC has not included construction of Hostel for Boys & Girls, compound wall, internal roads and other infrastructure in their present scope of civil contract and the CIPET Institute will not be complete without these amenities and structures.

In order to provide the complete infrastructure for establishment of full-fledged CIPET Centre at Aurangabad and for smooth functioning of the academic programme as per AICTE norms and rendering the technology support to the Plastic and allied industries in the State of Maharashtra, the construction activities for Hostels, compound wall, internal roads, staff quarters and other infrastructure comprising of approximately 2170 Sq.Mtr. construction work needs to be completed by MIDC on urgent basis.

Chamber of Marathwada Industries and Agriculture(CMIA) has appealed to Govt.of Maharashtra & MIDC so that the said construction work can be completed on priority & CIPET Aurangabad centre gets the required infrastructure to start its operation on full-fledged basis for industries in Maharashtra to effectively avail the facilities being created at CIPET Aurangabad.

CMIA Hon.Secretary, Mr.Ashish Garde welcomed the Shri Bijoy Chatterjee, I.A.S., Secretary to the Govt. of India, Prof. (Dr.) S.K.Nayak, Director General CIPET & Mr.S.K.Sharma, Deputy Director of CIPET, who visited Aurangabad recently.

While interacting with the members of RAC CIPET Aurangabad, Shri Bijoy Chatterjee urged the representatives of Industry Associations to utilize the CIPET facilities like Training, Technical services. Further, he also briefed the Members that CIPET has got high reputation for its technical expertise and would be attaining the Deemed University status very soon & urged the CMIA delegates to bring more plastic industries in Aurangabad and Marathwada Region so that industries as well as CIPET will grow with industries in terms of academic as well as

technology development & for utilizing the services of CIPET to the fullest extent.
